

## Chapter 218

### OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

**[HISTORY: Adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Scott as indicated in article histories. Amendments noted where applicable.]**

#### ARTICLE I

##### Treasurer

**[Adopted 3-5-1984]**

#### **§ 218-1. Substitute for Treasurer's bond.**

Pursuant to § 70.67(2), Wis. Stats., the Town of Scott obligates itself to pay, if the Town of Scott Treasurer fails to do so, all state and county taxes required by law to be paid by such Treasurer to the County Treasurer. A certified copy of this article shall be filed with the Brown County Treasurer's office and shall remain in effect until a certified copy of its repeal is filed with such County Treasurer.

#### ARTICLE II

##### Constable

#### **§ 218-2. Statutory authority.**

Pursuant to §§ 60.22(4) and 60.35, Wis. Stats., 1983 Wisconsin Act 532, the Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Scott, Brown County, hereby establishes the jurisdiction and duties of the Town Constable of the Town of Scott, Brown County, as described herein.

#### **§ 218-3. Jurisdiction and duties.** <sup>1</sup>

The Town Constable of the Town of Scott, Brown County, shall, as directed by the Town Board and/or Town Office:

- A. Act on behalf of the Town Board in regard to small animal control (complaints of animals at large, noise, etc.).
- B. Act on behalf of the Town Board to provide control at Town meetings and elections as necessary.
- C. Act on behalf of the Town Board in regard to Town Code enforcement.

#### **§ 218-4. Nonexclusivity.**

- A. Other ordinances. Adoption of this article does not preclude the Town Board from adopting any other ordinance or providing for the enforcement of any other law or ordinance relating to the same or other matter.
- B. Other remedies. The jurisdiction and duties of the Town Constable as stated herein shall not preclude the Town Board or any other Town officer from proceeding under any ordinance or law or by any other enforcement method to enforce any ordinance, regulation, or order.
